What does the community judge do?

The community judge handles the minor criminal cases of residents from the Venserpolder neighbourhood. The community judge also chairs meetings to prevent legal matters from going to court. The community judge believes that problems are there to be solved.

The community judge discusses how problems can be resolved and who will help with all parties involved. During discussions with the community judge, the parties involved decide for themselves what agreements are made. In a trial, the community judge decides what to do. The community judge then monitors compliance with agreements.

How do you end up before the community judge?

Option 1

You will receive a summons from the court. This may be in one of the following situations:

- if your child does not go to school;
- if you don't pay your health insurance bills;
- if you are suspected of committing a minor offence.

Option 2

You sign up for a solution-oriented discussion. This may be in one of the following situations:

- a conflict between family members or current/former partners which you want to resolve together and make agreements on;
- if you are in a rehabilitation programme and you and your care provider think that a judge is needed for you to proceed in the best way or to better resolve your problems.
